FISH COMPETITION RULES AND ENTRY FORM

RULES:

- 1. Applicant must be a full member in good standing at the time of catch. (Tentatives or Non-Paying members are not eligible) Tentative Members are allowed to compete in the Annual Calico Derby.
- 2. Applicant must have a valid California fishing license at the time of catch for California fish. Fish and Game rules apply. For "Out of Country" or "Out of State" fish entries, the applicant must have taken the fish in compliance with the rules and regulations set by the region the fish was taken.
- 3. Catch must be taken Freediving. (Scuba is not allowed)
- 4. Catch is to be taken solely by the applicant submitting entry. (No other person may assist or second shoot a fish)
- 5. Entry must be submitted to an active board member within 30 days of the catch. For out of country or out of state catches, the fish application must be submitted within 30 days of one's return. If a board member is submitting a fish application, the board member must turn in the application to a board member other than himself/herself within 30 days.
- 6. Fish Applications may be submitted electronically. If application is being submitted by E-mail, the application must be E-mailed by the person submitting the application. A downloadable fish application is available online at www.longbeachneptunes.com. The application must be sent to all of the board members and Carbon Copied (cc'd) to the witness(s) of the catch. A digital photograph must accompany every application. Email submitted fish application by the applicant is considered an electronic signature and a physical signature is not necessary. The application must include contact telephone # and email address of the witness in case the board needs verification.
- Entries must be filled out completely before being submitted. The board reserves the right to reject any questionable fish applications.
- 8. For out of state or out of country awards, fish with forked tails are considered "Pelagic" and fish with Non-forked tails are considered "Reef" fish. (example: amberjack, wahoo, and yellowtail are considered "Pelagic" fish.)
- 9. Catch must be weighed on a good quality digital scale. Spring scales are no longer accepted. The scale must be in good operating condition. The board reserves the right to inspect any questionable scale.
- 10. A Photograph of the fish must be submitted with all entries. A Digital Photograph that is emailed to the board is acceptable.
- 11. Fish being submitted for "In-State" awards must be taken within the California border and within the boundaries defined for legal take of fish as defined by the current California DFG regulations.
- 12. Applicants submitting fish within 1% of catch weight is considered a tie. In case of a tie, a fish being weighed on a certified scale takes precedence over a fish weighed on a non-certified scale.
- 13. Fish being weighed on a boat will be subject to a 5% weight penalty if the fish is being compared to another entry with a land weighed fish.
- 14. All applications must be submitted by January 31st.
